


## The Personality of a Name

## Studio 46 Facts

The home of Studio 46 Guitars is located near the Saint John River in New Brunswick, Canada, and over its history, the river was used by logging companies to float their logs down to the lumber mills. Every so often, a few of the logs would go astray and get left behind, only to become waterlogged over time and sink to the bottom of the river. A local company has made a business of using divers to find these old-growth logs and hauling them out of the river. The wood undergoes a

"purification" process of sorts when submerged for years and years. Currents and water pressure removes the resin from the cells of the wood. Once removed from the water, these logs are then dried out very slowly, resulting in wood product that is highly sought after by artists and craftsmen alike.

The company that salvaged this wood has confirmed it has been under water for at least 100 years. We have allowed the lumber to accli-

matize in the workshop for a minimum of 30 months before using it for the back and sides. The results have been instruments with an astounding tone and remarkable resonance, and a very unique appearance.
